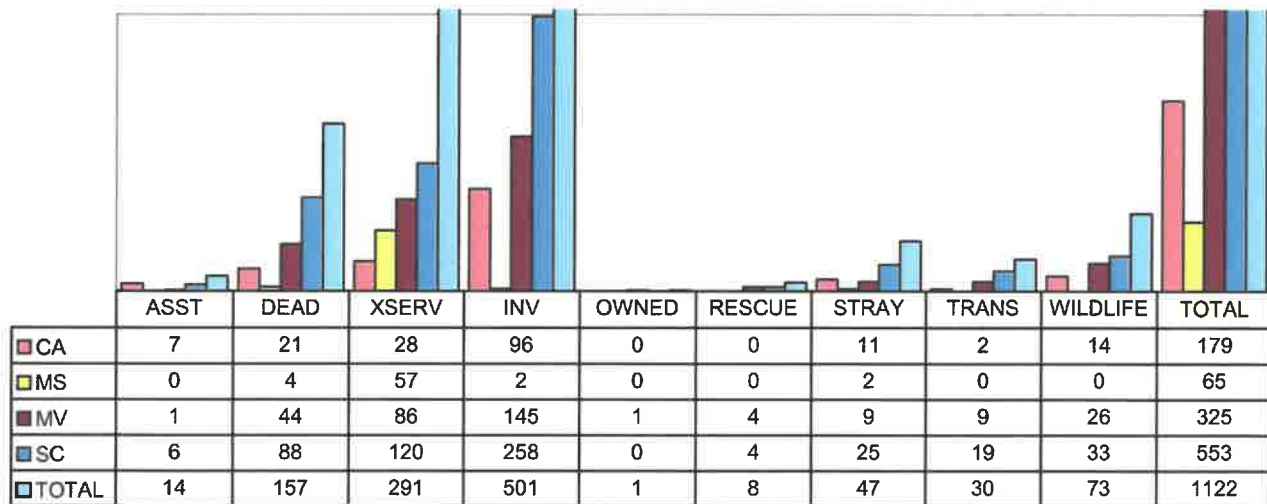
Introduction

This report provides graphs, tables and explanatory narratives covering five categories of information: field service calls, violations and citations issued, animals impounded, animals licensed, and animal outcomes. SVACA’s fiscal year is July 1 – June 30.

1. Field Service Calls

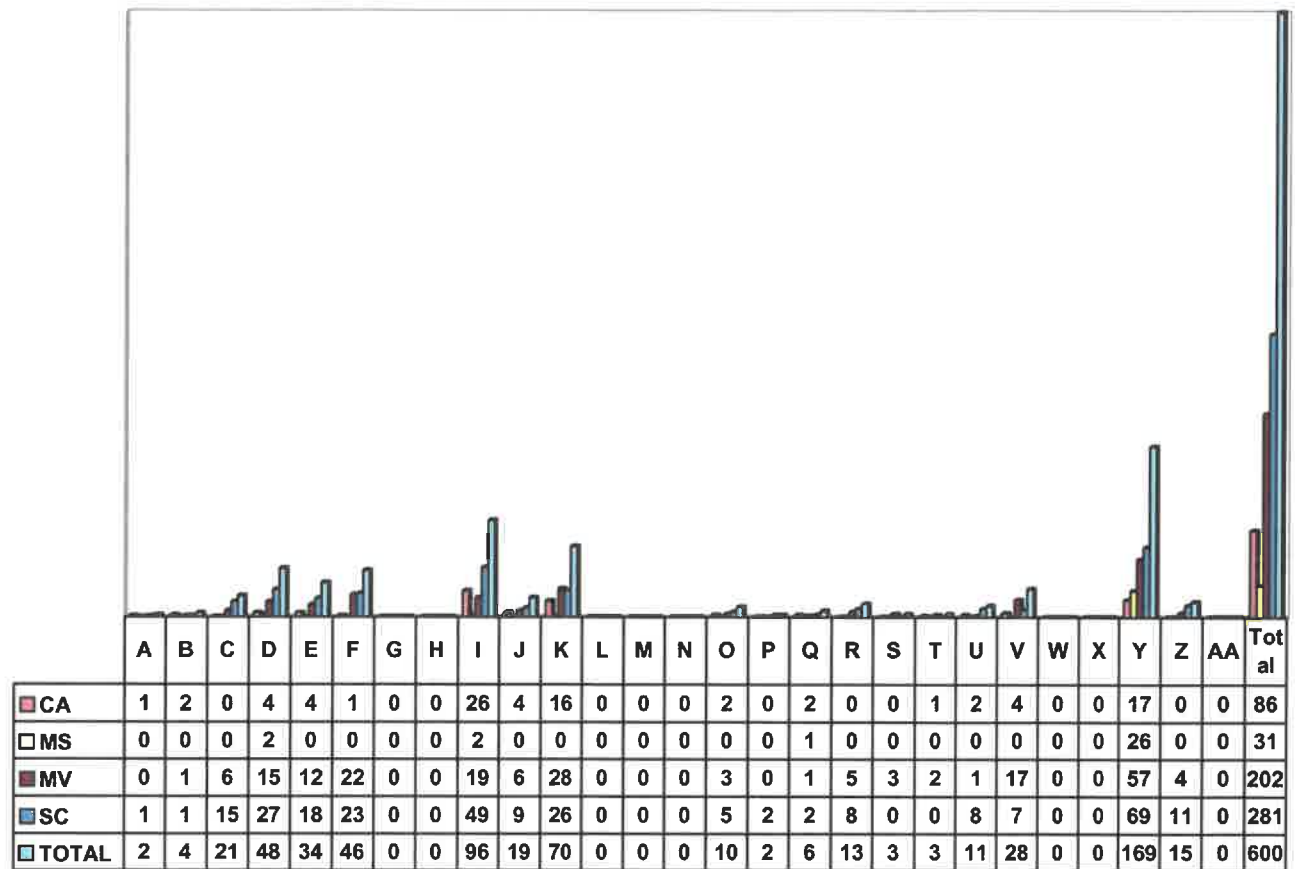

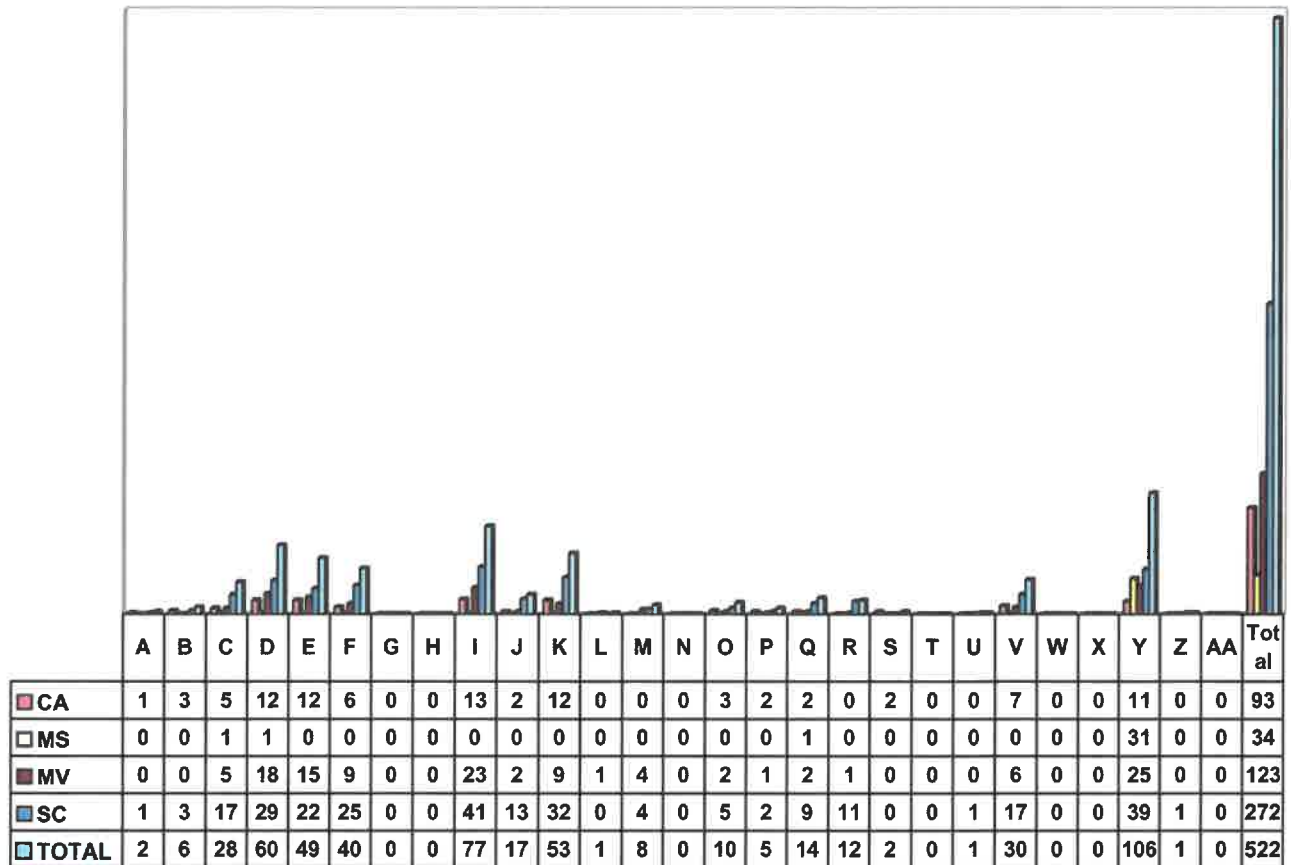
Graph 2a. - Total Service Calls by Jurisdiction, Type and Sub-Type for September 2021

Graph 2b. - Total Service Calls by Jurisdiction, Type and Sub-Type for October 2021



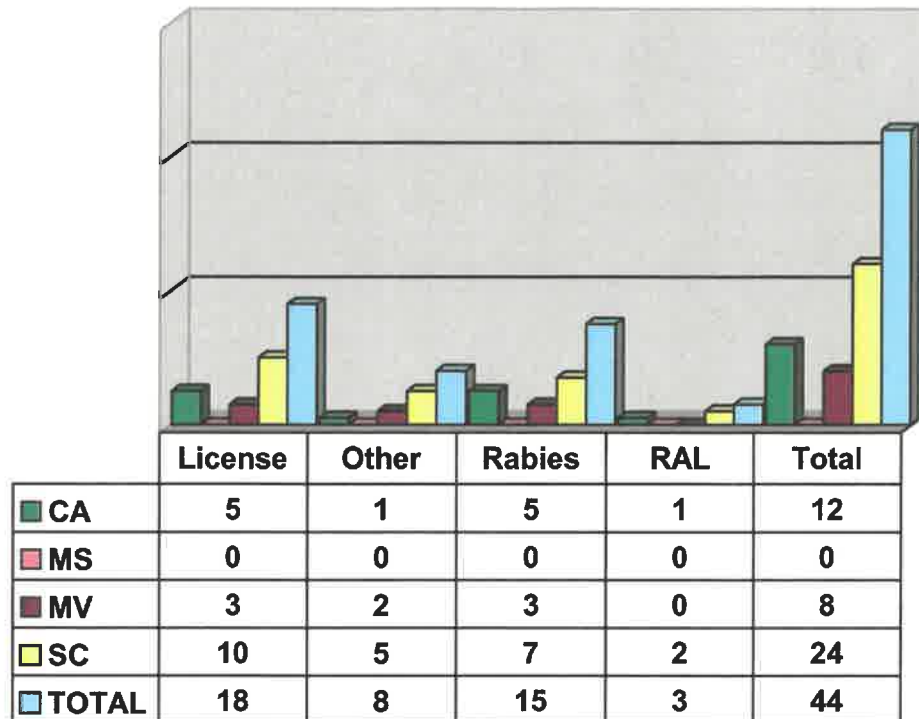

Year to Date Comparison of Violations for FY 2021-22 and FY 2020-21

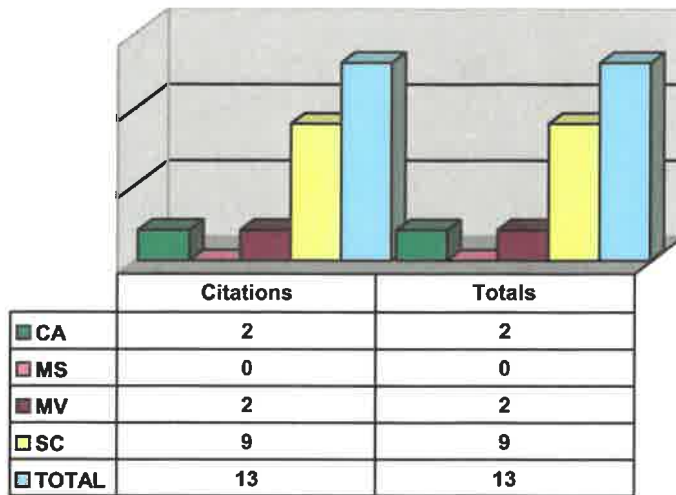

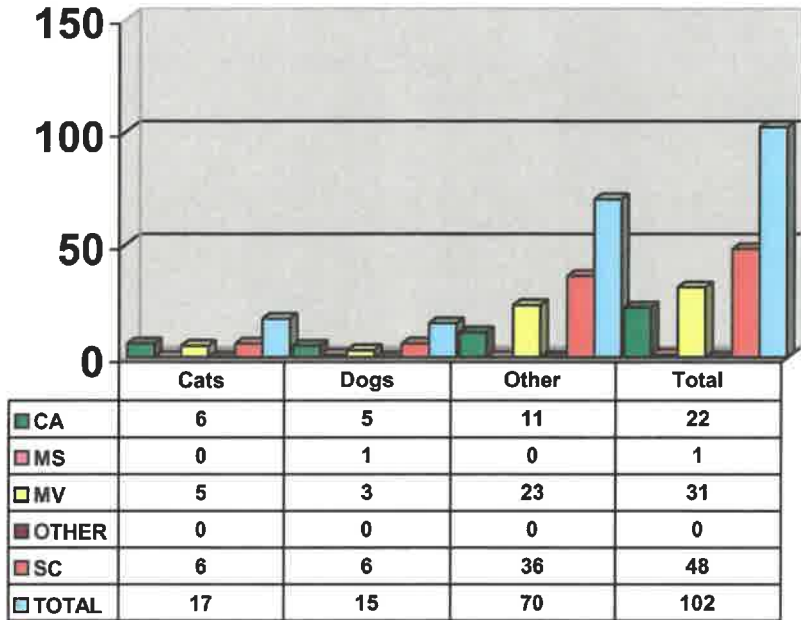

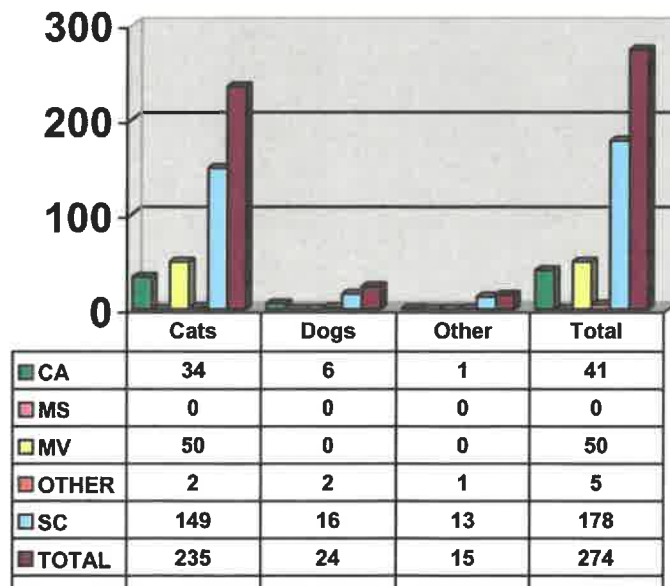
3. Animals Received at Center

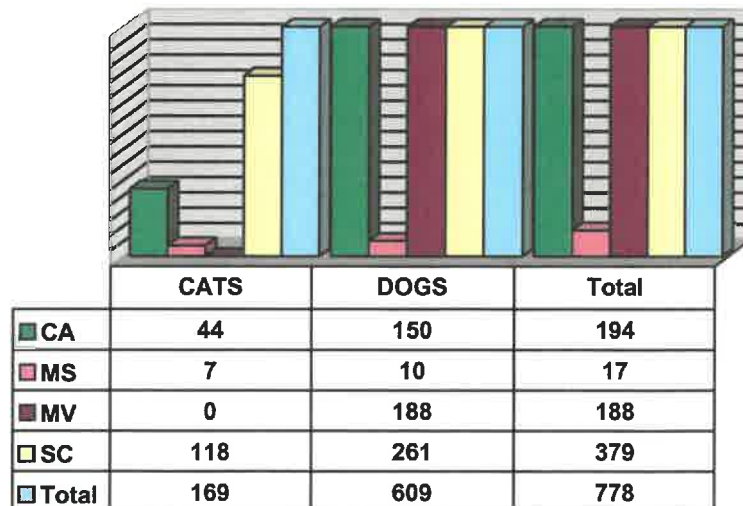

5. Animal Outcomes

The following tables reflect how our dogs and cats were outcomed at the center for the reporting period. The following is based on the Asilomar Accords (www.asilomaraccords.org) which were generated by animal welfare professionals as a way for agencies to accurately report a “Live Release Rate,” or how many animals had favorable outcomes. It also reports and categorizes why animals were euthanized. SVACA places all “healthy” and “treatable” animals as well as many “unhealthy” animals. SVACA’s Animal Care Center is “no kill” as we annually save greater than 90% of animals received.

ANIMAL CARE CENTER ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- SVACA's team continued to work through all pandemic related safety protocols, maintained our overall good health and have yet to have a COVID-19 positive case.
- The demand for service and animal intakes continued at prepandemic levels. The center continues to see more and more of the public returning to use our services and programs.
- Requests for field services continue to rise keeping our Animal Control Officers constantly on the go rescuing animals and protecting the public as well.

OUTREACH

- Fundraising
 - Pour for Paws took place on September 12 at Ainsley House in Campbell. The venue was perfect, and our supporters enjoyed a delicious brunch, mimosas, and wines donated by J. Lohr. The event grossed \$21,043 and netted \$11,524. We made some new friends and greeted many familiar faces. All pups in attendance were not only well-behaved, but dined at the doggy bar, where they were served gourmet cookies and treats.

- Volunteers
 - In September, we invited all active volunteers to return to the center, emphasizing that we need help with tasks such as animal care, janitorial and assistance with adoption animals.
 - In October, we began to recruit new volunteers and will begin holding regular orientations.
- Marketing
 - With quite a few adoption animals still looking for their forever homes, we opted to run a FALL in Love Adoption Special. Select animals were offered for no adoption fee, starting in early October through early November.

- Outreach

- The COVID-19 Relief Fund/Companion Animal Cupboard has continued to help our community's residents impacted by the pandemic. We've spayed, neutered, and vaccinated animals and continue to provide food and supplies monthly to participants.

MEDICAL TEAM

The following are a sampling of the good work that our medical team does day-in and out as we attempt to make sick and injured animals healthy so they can be adopted, released to a placement partner, or returned to their owner.

- In September, a tuxedo domestic medium community cat arrived at SVACA with an injured jaw and appeared to have been hit by a car. Treatment was provided, he responded well, and he was processed for return to his neighborhood.
- In October, another tuxedo community cat arrived with an injury. He had marked swelling on his cheek and frank blood in the oral cavity. Treatment was provided and he was monitored until his release back to his neighborhood; much to the pleasure of the many concerned residents.
- In October, a brown tabby community cat was brought in due to a neck wound. The reporting party had seen this cat in the area for a few years, but the wound had him worried. This type of wound is not uncommon to community cats and typically heals well with a combination of topical and systemic antibiotics. He is healing and should be released by the end of November.

FIELD SERVICES TEAM

- In Mountain View, Officer Morris responded to a kitten stuck in the engine compartment of a car. Officer Morris was able to locate the kitten but was unable to reach him. Officer Morris requested the assistance of Field Services Manger Pedrotti and they were able to safely capture the kitten. The kitten is currently in a foster home getting all the love and attention he needs. He should be available for adoption soon.
